The children have, as always, been very busy learning and playing together. Here is a flavour of what the children have been enjoying over the last couple of weeks:

Reception



Reception enjoyed exploring different balances in gymnastics. They are showing great skill in balancing both on the floor and on the equipment. We have been very impressed with how they are respecting each others' space and making sure they are safe when completing a sequence of balances.

Year 1

Year 1 went on local walk to identify the features of winter. They observed trees and plants during their walk and discussed how they may look different in spring. Before they went on their walk, they looked closely at the map of Little Leigh to decide which route to take to get to the river.



Year 2



Year 2 have been litter picking in the school grounds after learning the importance of keeping the environment clean and tidy when reading their English text, Tidy. They then wrote letters to Mrs Clarke explaining why it was important, and what we needed to do about it!

Year 3

Year 3 got stuck into some bush craft skills with Mr Weston this week in forest school. They used peelers to whittle sticks into small spears or arrows and practised fire safety whilst making sparks. Throughout this session, they retrieved knowledge from a previous history unit about the Stone Age and made connections between the skills they were learning and life at that time.



Year 4



Year 4 have made fantastic progress with their times tables! They have been working hard every day to recall their times tables and beat their high score on Times Table Rock Stars. They are well underway with their MTC practice. Well done Year 4!

Year 5

Year 5 have embraced the opportunity to try a new instrument in our music lessons with Miss Whyle. They are learning to play a selection of different songs on the baritone, trumpet and trombone. They can already play A, D and C on our instruments and look forward to learning some more new songs in the coming weeks as they prepare for their concert.

Year 6



Year 6 enjoyed a trip to Bramall Hall on Monday to enhance their learning about Henry VIII and The Tudors. They spent the day looking around the house, dressing in Tudor clothes, experimenting with wattle and daub and practising Tudor writing with ink and quills! The children had lots of fun and learnt a lot of interesting facts too!

The school councillors visited all the year groups to complete the survey so that they can look at the data and make an action plan for the year. What a fabulous start to their work as a school council!



A Kind Request
